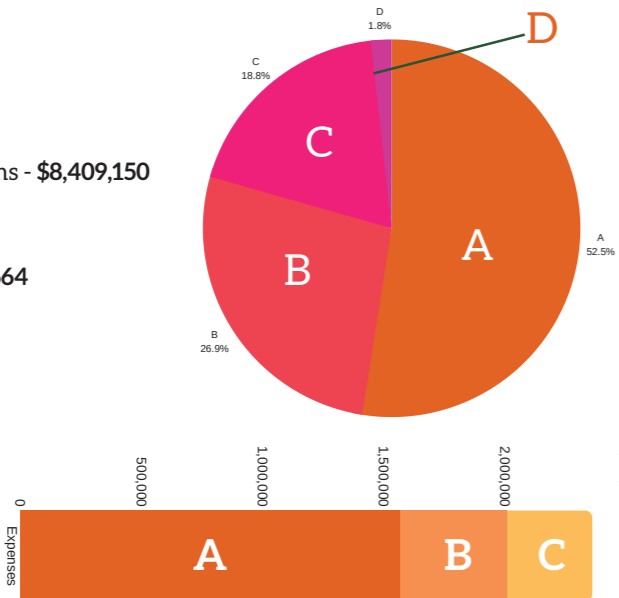

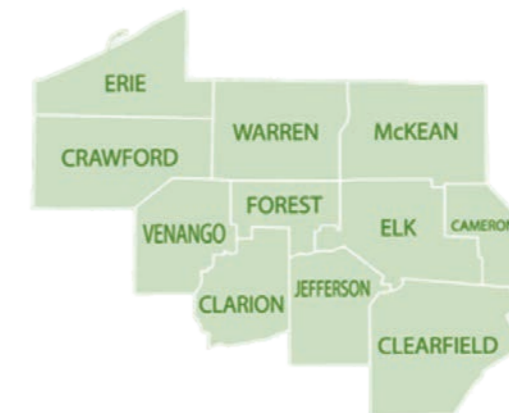

Who We Are

Second Harvest Food Bank of Northwest Pennsylvania is the largest nonprofit food distribution organization in northwest Pennsylvania and the only food bank in the region. Second Harvest solicits, receives, inventories, stores and distributes millions of pounds of grocery products each year through an anti-hunger network of 395 member agencies and distribution partners that serve people facing hard times in our 11-county service area.



Our Anti-Hunger Network

Second Harvest distributes grocery products through food pantries, soup kitchens, emergency shelters and other charities. We also partner with other organizations to operate School Pantries, Backpack programs, Produce Express distributions, Military Share distributions and Senior Box programs.

Helping Those in Need

A total of 85,420 individuals in northwest Pennsylvania, including nearly 26,940 children under the age of 18, are without reliable access to a sufficient quantity of affordable, nutritious food. Recipients who receive food free of charge include unemployed and underemployed workers, the homeless, senior citizens, individuals with disabilities, families in crisis situations and children. In our most recent fiscal year, Second Harvest's anti-hunger network distributed 10.3 million meals.

Our Programs

Produce Express

The Produce Express program delivers food where traditional food pantries are not available. By providing fresh, healthy produce to those who normally would not have access to it, Second Harvest is working to encourage healthier eating and better nutritional choices.

Military Share

In northwest Pennsylvania, nearly 18% of households receiving food assistance have at least one member who has served or is currently serving in the military. Military Share, a Produce Express program, is designed to provide fresh, nutritious foods for veterans and military families.

Milk Initiative

There are many costs to acquiring, handling and distributing milk to our neighbors in need. Through a statewide initiative, *Fill a Glass with Hope*, Second Harvest is working to bring fresh milk to the tables of families in the 11 counties of northwest Pennsylvania with the support of our many local volunteers and generous donors.

Child Feeding Programs

For many children in our service area, school breakfasts and lunches may be the only meals they consistently receive. To ensure these children receive proper nutrition on weekends, the **Second Harvest Backpack program** provides nutritious, child-friendly food to students on Fridays. Studies find that when children are hungry, their parents, siblings and other relatives are, too. The **Second Harvest School Pantry program** provides food and other necessities to these children and their families in safe, familiar locations.

Senior Boxes

Many seniors in northwest Pennsylvania are faced with making decisions such as paying for medicine or buying groceries. To help alleviate the stress of these decisions, the U.S.D.A. provides food items for distribution to low-income seniors through the Senior Box program.



Donate Funds

The efforts of Second Harvest would not be possible without the generous support from individuals throughout the community. Every contribution makes an impact because each dollar donated enables us to provide **6 meals** to our neighbors in need.

Host a Food Drive

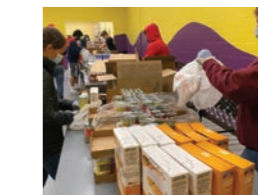

Donate Time

Volunteers are critical to the mission and success of Second Harvest. Last year, over 2,100 community members volunteered to help us carry out our mission. Individuals, families and groups are welcome. Volunteer shifts are available at various times throughout the week.

Volunteer Projects

Grocery Reclamation - Sorting, labeling and repackaging food.

Backpack Program - Packing bags containing enough food for children to have multiple breakfasts, lunches and dinners over the weekends.

Senior Boxes - Packing supplemental food boxes to be distributed to low-income seniors each month.

Cleaning - Meet Second Harvest staff members at local farms to harvest fruits and vegetables. This is a great volunteer opportunity for large groups.

Produce Express & Military Share Distributions - Meet Second Harvest staff members at distribution sites to help distribute fresh, nutritious produce and other grocery items to those in need.
