Perspective:



As the Chief Executive Officer of the Second Harvest Food Bank of Northwest Pennsylvania, it is an honor and privilege to serve our mission. I am overwhelmed with gratitude for the work we have been able to accomplish together to build stronger communities. And, although our world is still dealing with COVID-19, the changing season gives us new hope.

The pandemic reminded us that many families are living paycheck to paycheck and hunger can very easily happen to anyone; be it a job loss, illness, or simply a reduction in pay. With the price of gas, groceries, and goods rising, it is almost certain that food-insecurity for many new families will follow.

The most recent Map the Meal Gap Study from Feeding America tells us that 1 in 8 people within our 11-county service area are hungry. Sadly, 1 in 6 of those individuals are children, just like our cover photo of young Katrina. For her mother P.J., and for many families in Northwest Pennsylvania, the struggle of hunger is far from over.

One factor that can be depended upon is Second Harvest's commitment to reach seniors, children, and families who are in need of food. Our Produce Express Program continues to distribute fresh fruits and vegetables, milk, eggs, and other pantry items off the back of our truck in poverty-stricken neighborhoods. The BackPack and School Pantry programs provide child-friendly food to students so that they do not miss a meal over the weekend. So that they never have to make the difficult choice between purchasing much needed medicine or food, a 30-pound box of non-perishable food is delivered each month to low-income seniors through our senior box program. With these programs and many more, Second Harvest Food Bank is reaching those who are most vulnerable, making sure that they never miss a meal.

Second Harvest, in turn, relies on our donors to help fund the many programs that we administer. Last year, our food donors, financial supporters, and volunteers never skipped a beat. With your help, we were able to provide over 10 million meals to hungry individuals in our area. We are truly blessed for all the support we have received during this global pandemic. From the bottom of my heart, I thank you for believing in our mission.

As we plan for the future, our vision remains the same: a hunger-free community. We kindly ask that you consider donating your time, talent, or treasure to help us serve the food insecure population within Northwest Pennsylvania. I am immensely proud of what we accomplish here at Second Harvest Food Bank and hope that we can continue to rely on our beloved community to help us pursue our dream of alleviating hunger.

Wegmans Supporting Local Food Banks

According to Feeding America's most recent Map the Meal Gap Study, more than 88,000 individuals in Northwest Pennsylvania are food-insecure. That is approximately 13% of our total population. To address the issue of hunger in our community, Second Harvest Food Bank of Northwest Pennsylvania partnered with our local Wegmans supermarkets for their annual *Check Out Hunger* initiative.

Between February 1st and March 12th of 2022, area Wegmans locations invited customers to donate to Second Harvest at the checkout register in order to help their fellow neighbors in need. All donations went directly to Second Harvest to support our anti-hunger programming in the community. Customers who donated \$5 or more were entered to win a Wegmans gift card. The five cashiers at each Wegmans location who raised the most money will have a lunch celebration with store leadership to recognize their efforts.

In total, the 2022 Check Out Hunger campaign raised \$89,394. These funds will help Second Harvest provide thousands of meals to our food-insecure community members. Second Harvest's partnership with Wegmans was recently strengthened with the addition of a new Board Member, Ryan Salvo. Ryan is the General Manager of the West Ridge Wegmans location and joined Second Harvest's Board of Directors in 2021. Thank you, Wegmans!

"The success of this fundraising effort is fully dependent on the generosity of our customers," said Ryan. "They continue to support our efforts for the community at an incredible level. Our team of dedicated cashiers and front-end staff do an amazing job for the community year after year. I'm honored to serve on the Board of Directors at Second Harvest and will look for every opportunity to grow the already incredible relationship between Wegmans and Second Harvest."

Second Harvest Programming:

Food Rescue & MealConnect

Approximately 40% of food that is produced in the United States is wasted before it can be consumed (Feeding America). Second Harvest's Food Rescue Program aims to address the issue of throwing away nutritious food that could be used to feed our hungry neighbors.

Our food rescue efforts have expanded over the past year, including gleaning from area farms and building new relationships with retail stores. Recently, Feeding America

introduced a new website called MealConnect. This website streamlines the food rescue process, connecting retail food donors directly to nearby member agencies who can pick up leftover food that would otherwise be wasted. Agencies can then distribute this extra food to their community members in need.

In 2021, Second Harvest rescued 5 million pounds of food. Since MealConnect was launched, 67 nonprofits have signed on as well as 59 stores and restaurants. To learn more about the Food Rescue Program and MealConnect, please visit our website at www.nwpafoodbank.org.
